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February 2017 Program – Barbara De Pirro

Barbara De Pirro is a painter, sculptor, installation artist and educator, sponsored by Golden Artist Colors, Inc. She works both two and three dimensionally, translating her concepts from one media to the other. Her expansive knowledge of acrylic, combined equally with her broad understanding of a full range of media opens the door to vast possibilities. She generously shares all of this in her workshops and

lectures.

De Pirro's artwork has

been commissioned and exhibited in Museums, Galleries, Sculpture Parks, Art Centers and Public Art Organizations. Her artwork has been published in multiple articles, publications and books. De Pirro is a member of Northwest Designer Craftsman, Surface Design Association, and National Basketry Organization; she has received both a Grant and Fellowships through Artist Trust.

In this presentation De Pirro will cover a variety of techniques for both Mixed Media & Collage. She will share a range of examples including

those she uses in her own artwork. Some of these techniques include Textural Surfaces, Printmaking, Image Transfer and Encaustic Effects with Acrylic. These examples will not only highlight her own ideas and techniques but they will illuminate the unique qualities of Golden Acrylic paints, gels, mediums, grounds, pastes and the endless possibilities. Attending artists will also receive Information packets and free product samples by Golden Artist Colors.

November Program Notes – Robert Stockton, 50 Years of Keeping a Sketchbook

Robert Stockton's early sketchbooks show his life-long proclivity for collage. They contain found scraps from the streets of San Francisco, billboard papers, unusual maps and vintage ephemera. The Sketchbook becomes a resource and a place for experimentation where you can explore beyond your comfort zone.

Robert's art journey began with a high school class field trip to the Art of Assemblage show at San Francisco MOMA. Through his college days to his days as a high school art teacher, Stockton found connections that led to many opportunities for him to create, show, and teach his art.

Robert's early collages and shadow boxes were inspired by Schwitters, Cornell, Rauschenberg and others. He uses paper, fabric, metal and found objects, and he is most interested in surfaces that show marks by man or nature that give a sense of history where the object has been.

Robert showed samples of his work and the tools he uses. Some key items are: Lineco Neutral pH Adhesive, Lineco Pure Wheat Starch adhesive, US ArtQuest Perfect Paper Adhesive, and Yes! paste thinned down. He also uses Daniel Smith silver watercolor pigment, craft tape, Golden matte varnish, gels, molding paste and fiber paste, designer gouache, palette paper, etc...the list goes on and on.

Robert's artwork has been published in INCITE, The Best of Mixed Media and The Pulse of Mixed Media: Secrets and Passions of 100 Artists Revealed by Seth Apter (North Light Books). See more artwork at: www.absolutearts.com






