

Clive Knights will share images of some of his collages, prints, and publications, and will tell us a bit about himself and his artistic journey. He will then lead a workshop titled Depth Chamber: Inhabiting New Worlds Through the "Augmented Collage Spatial Study."

Participants will be introduced to a mode of creative practice that conjures new, imaginary, spatial worlds from found image fragments rich in material surface, light and shadow, perspectival depth, and human character.

The workshop will use a roundtable process that rotates collages through seven collaborative stages whereby new extemporary additions are added to each work as they pass through the imagination and collage input of each participant.

Please bring your own scissors (BYOS!), but glue sticks and all other materials will be supplied. Don't miss this chance to collaborate with other NWCS members and to bring forth into visibility imaginary spaces and invented chambers that would be impossible to conceive without this process.



Art by **Lynette Hensley** will be featured at <u>Lynn Hanson Gallery</u> (Seattle) for the month of August. The Pioneer Square First Thursday Art Walk is on August 1, and the artist reception is August 3.

Nostalgia is the theme of Lynette's newest work, shown for the first time at this exhibit, along with many other recent paintings, collages and her assemblage sculptures, known as the Actors.

"I developed this collection of collage paintings from vintage photographs of people in informal settings. I believe that all the people in the photos were well loved or admired by their picture taker. The photos are old enough that all the people are surely gone from this earth. None are known to me. Why the photos were discarded and available to me is such a curious thing. So, I honor these people, and give them new experiences that are not too, too different than what they knew as they lived. Some are near cars or by the beach, some in gardens or on holiday. They all had their own loves and wishes. They told me so."

Curt Bloch's Het Onderwater Cabaret



Het Onderwater Cabaret 23 Sept 1944, Issue 66

While in Berlin, NWCS President Cheryl Chudyk visited the Jüdisches Museum Berlin (Jewish Museum Berlin, JMB) to view the 150 pieces of Curt Bloch's work exhibited in *My Verses Are Like Dynamite*. The core of the exhibit was Bloch's weekly magazine *Het Onderwater Caberet*, created while hiding in the crawlspace of a Dutch home during WWII for almost two years. The magazine was pocket-sized to allow for discreet distribution and made using collage and handwritten poetry.

All 95 issues of the magazine are <u>now available for viewing</u> on JMB's website. There is also a <u>special issue of the JMB Journal</u> <u>which can be viewed online</u> with additional information about the circumstances of Bloch's act of creative resistance and links to related resources.

Here is a gift link to the NYTimes article about Bloch and distribution of the magazine (gift link expires June 28). A website thoroughly documenting Bloch's creative legacy is also available.

The exhibit was so well-curated, showing clippings from magazines (right) to show how Bloch used them in his photomontages and collages (above).




Bloch used caricatures by political satirist Leendert Jurriaan Jordaan (left) to create the montage on the right, depicting Josef Stalin, British Prime Minister Winston Churchill, and President Franklin D. Roosevelt, whose head is collaged over a caricature of French Prime Minister Léon Blum walking a tightrope while weightlifting. The montage accompanied Bloch's poem "Driemogendhedon conferentie" (Three Powers Conference) in which Bloch calls for a second front to be opened against the Germans in the west.

The montage at left accompanied "Image Cult," Bloch's poem that poked fun at the German's hero worship. The source material for the montage came from a portrait of Hitler used to illustrate an antifascist novel serialized in the magazine Wij, Ons Werk, Ons Leven (We, Our Work, Our Life), shown upper right, a photo of actor Paul Hartmann portraying Otto von Bismarck shown upper left, and colored margins from the covers of Koralle (Coral) magazine for a striking background.


