### PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Kolaj Fest 2024 did not disappoint. I shared an Airbnb with eight great artists including NWCS members Kathryn Kim, Dawn Conry, and Jennifer Roche, as well as friends from Canada, Ireland, and across the US. On day one we enjoyed the beautiful Museum of New Orleans where an impromptu Recycle Challenge runway walk complete with an opera singer stole the show (photos next page). Kathryn screened her short collage animation film that she completed an artist residency in the latter part of 2023, and, inspired by Torea Frey's World Collage Day piñatas, I whipped together a piñata (so they could "break my heart") and helped host a game night that included blind-folded collage and 20 short minutes to fashion a piece of wearable collage.







### **Torea Frey** *The Beauty Who Thinks*

Narrative scroll on paper with mixed media that dispenses with the admonitions and celebrates women in all their forms; Made with vintage print media, acrylic paint, and glue.



### **NW COLLAGE SOCIETY AWARD**

Kathryn Kim Apron Strings

Containing a mashup of prose, poems, song lyrics, lines from a play, and a biblical quotation about aprons and/or their strings, this collage reflects the ancient practice of signifying rank using stripes on an apron -- a narrow one meaning apprentice, a broader second stripe indicating a master, and a third disclosing that the master has taken on an apprentice; Made with individually cut and pasted letters on Swedish tracing paper, embellished with stitching.

Collage of photos from Italy and the iconic roman Umbrella Pine. Collaged together using an adapted Bojagi method; Made with Gampi paper, photography, and encaustic.

### 2024 DAY RETREAT





#### **Newsletter Editor**

Andrea is moving to the Shows committee to join Jan and Sylvia, so we are in need of a Newsletter Editor. She has been creating the newsletters in Canva and is happy to transfer templates. A Jotform is shared with the Social Media person to facilitate receiving member news, and distribution of the newsletter and reminder emails are sent using the MailerLite platform (similar to Mailchimp) which means they can be scheduled and automated.

- The newsletter editor will create, publish, and distribute (electronically) a newsletter 5 times per year. The contents of the newsletter will include NWCS activities, membership news, meeting notes, and upcoming events, and photos as available.
- The editor will maintain archival PDF copies of all past newsletters they have created.
- The newsletter editor may distribute email messages to the membership, with NWCS specific relevant art news, announcements, calls for artists, etc. Email addresses will be obtained from the membership chair, for newsletter distribution to paid members.
- The editor will request information and member news two weeks prior to all NWCS Board meetings; the newsletter will be published and emailed to members not later than the first day of the month in which the general meeting is held.
- In order to publish the newsletter, the editor will need to have software and knowledge of desktop publishing, to layout both text and image and to format documents for electronic messaging (e.g., Word, Publisher, InDesign, Canva etc.). Photo editing software is helpful for members' images that are published (e.g., Photoshop, PhotoStudio, Affinity Photo, etc.).

# Intertwined Wangechi Mutu at New Orleans Museum of Art

The New Orleans Museum of Art exhibited Wangechi Mutu's solo exhibition Intertwined in the first half of 2024, featuring almost 100 of her works from the last three decades. During Kolaj Fest, Jennella Young and LaVonna Varnado-Brown gave a tour of the exhibit. The title of the show was inspired by a collage of the same title that Mutu made in 2003, which itself was inspired by a National Geographic photograph.

Mutu uses everything from Kenyan soil, to hair, to paper pulp, to magazines and vintage illustrations. Deified and sometimes alien-like hybrids of female figures emerge in film, performance, sculpture, paintings, and larger than life collages as she grapples with cultural and socio-political dichotomies inherent in her time spent between Brooklyn and Nairobi. Her pieces feel at once like ancestral yet futuristic incantations, chimerically grafting and reimagining the female figure. Mutu can create regal female deities cast in bronze, while also embracing bricolage with soil and acrylic high heels shoes to create forms reminiscent of pelvic bones. Her works encompass sexuality, symbiosis, virology, race, ritual, and myth, while processing ecosystem imbalances, colonization and genocide.


The <u>New York Times had a great article</u> (gift link) when Mutu exhibited at the <u>New Museum</u> in 2023. <u>Ocula Magazine</u> has some great photos of that exhibition. There is a fantastic interview with Mutu at the <u>Oral History Project</u> that I would encourage everyone to read. I somehow failed to photograph her collages that were 8 feet high – I encourage you to immerse yourself in that article, where she speaks to the reasoning for her small scale work.




