Colette Fu is a Philadelphia-based visual artist who received her MFA in Fine Art Photography from the Rochester Institute of Technology in 2003, and soon after began devising complex compositions that incorporate photography and pop-up paper engineering. Her pop-up books are included in the National Museum of Women in the Arts, Library of Congress, Metropolitan Museum of Art, Getty Research Institute, and many private and rare archive collections. Fu's numerous awards and grants include a Forman Arts Initiative Art Works grant, Philadelphia Cultural Treasures grant, Joan Mitchell Painter's & Sculptors Fellowship, the Meggendorfer Prize, Leeway Transformation Award, and a Fulbright Research Fellowship to China. She exhibits widely and teaches pop-up courses and community workshops internationally.



**Andrea Lewicki** was selected as one of the artists in Schack Art Center's 6-month residency program which began in September and runs until March 2026. She is using the residency as a testing ground for a book she is writing and as part of her research, she is hosting drop-in collage sessions. You are welcome to bring your own projects or use a provided prompt. All are welcome!







MJ Connors-Davison, from Portland, who is the originator of Exquisite Community (based on the 100 year old Surrealist game "Exquisite Corpse), where collage and mixed media artists in groups of four each created a section of the human figure without knowing what the other members in their group were creating. MJ has produced a book, called "EVERY BODY 2021-2025, measuring 6"x17", on heavyweight cardstock, which depicts all 41 exquisite corpse figures. Limited to 50, signed and numbered copies the colors and printing are outstanding! Obviously a labor of love by MJ! Robert Stockton is assisting MJ in getting copies into the hands of those who may want them. The price is \$35/copy and may be paid through a QR code that MJ has provided. For those interested in purchasing a copy, Robert Stockton will be at the collage meet-up at Third Place Commons on November 13, and will have several copies to sell. The exquisite corpse pictured above was completed by Robert Stockton, John Arbuckle, Craig van den Bosch, and Elsa Bouman.



"I belong to a 7-member ATC group in which ATCs are created for the other 6 members on a quarterly basis. Each quarter, the ATCs we create are based on a prompt from one of the group's members. The prompt for Fall Quarter, 2025 tasked us with creating ATCs that incorporated a "moveable element". Coming up with an idea I liked for this prompt took me quite awhile. Eventually I had the idea to create a double-sided ATC with about a 1/16th depth in between the two sides (using mat board). The collages for each side of the ATC were created and then holes were punched into these with circular and square hole punches. The two sides were mounted on a U-shaped piece of mat board, allowing another two-sided piece of card stock with color photo copies of other collages to be used as a moveable insert. Each ATC, then, had 8 different compositional variations available to the viewer. Pictured are all possible variations of one of the six ATCs created." — Robert Stockton


In August, NWCS member Clive Knights attended a two week Nature, Art & Habitat Residency program in the small hill town of Sottochiesa in the Taleggio Valley, just north of Bergamo, Italy. Titled 'Citta Minerale', he explored the relationships between the autochthonous and the cultivated in the context of the Italian countryside of Taleggio. He created drawings and collage work deploying papers from the vicinity combined with new hand-painted and stained papers made on site in response to the atmospheric and mineral character of the terrain, incorporating organic and mineral substances from which to concoct pigments and construct mark making tools.





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### **PUBLICATIONS**



Clive has recently published a new visually rich book presenting over eighty augmented collage spatial studies, also known as Depth Chambers, created at collaborative community collage-making workshops led by him over many years, including one at the Northwest Collage Society. Each collage is created by eight participants who each contribute a single fragment in a staged roundtable process to collectively construe an imagined interior setting. The final act is to add tonality using charcoal dust to explore effects of chiaroscuro and the synthesize the piece. The workshop has been offered nationally to high-schoolers, professional architects, international collage artists, university academics, art students, and the general public, together with its regular deployment in design studio classes with students of architecture at the School of Architecture, Portland State University, where the author is a professor and was the founding director.

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
### COLLAGE




#### **Coastal Collage Camp**



#### Co-creating the city

Sitting in the shade of a tree planted a long time ago by someone you have never met, exchanging a few words with the guy sitting next to you on the subway, leaving a work of art on the wall of a building for all who pass by in the coming weeks ...

The city is a shared experience permanently moving like a dance. A dance that is sometimes harmonious and sometimes involves a painful kick to the foot.

Berlinage #3 is dedicated to the topic of cocreating the city. May 6-17, 2026.

Where is your place in this structure? How do you relate? What do you contribute? How do we create together?

In a time when it seems increasingly difficult for us humans to inhabit this world together without fighting, Berlinage #3 is about celebrating the collage community. It is about coming together and sharing – sharing techniques, working methods, ideas (and of course a drink or two).

The two-part residency proved successful in Berlinage #2: In the weeks before we gather in Berlin,

each artist creates one or more works on the theme "Me and the City," and we meet occasionally via Zoom. Here in Berlin, we will devote ourselves to working together.

The group show in the beautifully located Aquabit Art gallery will be on for five days this time (May 13-17). There will be another shared work space the week before and guided tours.
