#### June 2020 PROGRAM PREVIEW

Kathy Ross has been a working artist most of her life. She has utilized many kinds of materials, most of them sculptural, to create some fascinating pieces of artwork. Kathy's current work includes: 1) Map/book-collaged and bejeweled figures and clothing pieces (which look wearable, but aren't). These sculptures can sometimes become

armatures for embellishment/encrustation/ adornment with all kinds of shiny/strange found objects. 2) Found tea/cookie tins (cut up and soldered) to make sculptures resembling figures, vehicles, houses, globes. "I like cookie tins for the colours, and the way the sculpture and the surface treatment are one process; the challenge of making something flat behave like something 3-dimensional." ### February 2020 Program Notes "Marble-ology"

NWCS members Kathryn Kim and Carole Carroll presented a program on the history of marbling, focusing on paper marbling through the ages, from medieval times to the present. After a very informative slide presentation, several techniques were demonstrated: Suminagashi, sumi marbling kits, methylcellulose & acrylic, stone pattern, stencil method, and shaving cream. At the end of the program, members were invited to tryout the papers and materials to create their own marbled paper samples.




