PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

We have two wonderful shows up and on display this Spring. The Artist Reception for Collage at the Lodge exhibit is Sunday **April 10, 2-4pm**—come and meet the juror and mingle with other NWCS members. The Collage: Small Works exhibit at the Francis Anderson Arts Festival Gallery in Edmonds is finally up and looks great! Join Art Walk Edmonds on Thursday **April 21** and meet the juror at 6pm.

Spring is bringing forth a multitude of art shows for us to enter and so I hope everyone is making opportunities to create. I have papers scattered across my studio as ideas tumble over each other in an effort to be pushed into existence. Some fly and some end up in the 'development' pile. But still, when I'm in the 'zone' it is rewarding.

Sometimes when I tell people I'm a collage artist, they give me a bit of a blank look. So I did a bit of reading up on how I might concisely describe my art medium of choice. I thought I'd share a few of these definitions with you. Ultimately, I think Max Ernst says it best in the quote at the end.

Definitions for collage and related disciplines:

Collage - A collage (from the French word coller, to glue) is a work of formal art made by gluing different pieces of paper, photographs, fabric and other ephemera onto a supporting surface, thus creating a new whole. The term collage was coined by both Georges Braque and Pablo Picasso in the beginning of the 20th century when collage became a distinctive part of modern art.

The process of collage focuses on the act of selecting materials and cutting them into the desired shape, before arranging them and pasting them onto the chosen surface. Unlike other art forms that may rely on proficient technical skills such as painting and sculpture, the artistic expertise of collage lies in the choosing, arranging and affixing.

Collage - is a work that combines and juxtaposes diverse, pre-existing materials on a two-dimensional surface using glue. A three-dimensional collage is generally called an Assemblage. If the collage incorporates traditional art media and techniques, like painting or drawing, into the composition, it is often referred to as Mixed Media.

Other terms:

Decoupage - (a French term meaning "cutting out") originated in the 18th century as a craft of applying decorative paper cut-outs to wood, glass or other surfaces, sealing with multiple layers of varnish (or glue). Decoupage is traditionally used to decorate three-dimensional items like furniture, boxes, dishes, etc.

Montage - is the action of assembling. The technique of combining in a single composition pictorial elements from various sources to either give the illusion that the elements belonged together originally or to allow each element to retain its separate identity as a means of adding interest or meaning to the composition.

Photomontage - is a collage constructed from photographs. And may be either analog or digital.

Digital Collage - (also referred to as eCollage) is created using computer programs, such as Photoshop to create overlapping layers and juxtaposed associations. The final image is then distributed via electronic media or printed.

Papier collé translates as 'pasted paper' and refers to the exclusive use of paper stuck onto a flat surface, as opposed to collage, which employs different materials.

Décollage is a French word meaning to unstick, which involves tearing away built-up advertisement posters to reveal images and words below. This term is largely associated with the nouveau réalisme movement founded in 1960.

The collage, an artistic technique in which diverse pictorial elements are pasted together on a surface, was characterized by Max Ernst as follows:

"The collage technique is the systematic exploitation of the accidentally or artificially provoked encounter of two or more foreign realities on a seemingly incongruous level – and the spark of poetry that leaps across the gap as these two realities are brought together." 



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

Cheryl Chudyk is co-hosting, with Kevin Sampsell, a casual collage making event in Portland April 9th from 10-2pm at True North Studios in Portland. RSVP <u>here</u>.

Spring has sprung at **Cheryl** and Kevin's <u>Sharp Hands Gallery</u>, where six artists make six pieces of work specifically for this online exhibition. Indonesian artist Irene Febry sculpts igneous, fossil-like forms that juxtapose the primal elements with modern day climate change. Brooklyn-based Andrea Burgay transfigures forgotten fiction into ripples of ethereal chaos while Portland-based Laura Weiler suspends fractured fragments within portraits and landscapes. Filipino/Canadian artist Melanie Garcia creates a push and pull of depth and intangibility with negative space active with marks and brushwork. Doug Schulte (Arlington, Virginia) creates abstract portraits of domesticity that feel like silent, nostalgic dreams. UK-based collagist Shaun Keenan's creations are reminiscent of Robert Motherwell's art, and his heightened intuition in the wee hours of the night reminds me of a John Stezaker quote:



"In the early hours, through tiredness, the unconscious takes over and that is when the real creativity happens."

In 2019, Portland collage maker Clive Knights put out an international call for submissions of new work from collage artists, asking them to respond to nine "muses," characterized as the bodily necessities of breathing, nourishing, sleeping, discharging waste,

procreating, resisting the earth's pull, communicating, aging and dying. The result is 'Corporeal Gestures: An International Exhibition of Contemporary Collage,' a curated collection of work by more than 100 collage artists from 21 countries.



The work presents a diverse response to the ways in which our actions, rhythms, relationships and shared experience of being alive are both predetermined and made possible by the modicum of matter borrowed from the world that constitutes each of our bodies. The project challenged collage artists to consider how one's body is activated in the world – acting, gesturing, making – amidst the shared rhythms pertaining to our common, mortal predicament in a single, unfolding cosmos. A fully illustrated catalogue will accompany the exhibition.

On exhibit throughout the 2nd floor of Shattuck Hall will be enlarged representations of 114 collages submitted by collage artists from as far away as Australia, Brazil, Ukraine and 18 other countries, including many from the USA.

This project is inspired by the meditative exercises of the Japanese Enso. Participants are called on to explore their individuality, beauty, imagination, promotional gestures, and intuition. "Look Around" invites the participants to make their own circle, create within that space, and then open up to others by looking without judgment at their works, contemplating and marveling at their diversity.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR MAKING YOUR COLLAGE

On a sheet measuring 8.5"x11" (21.6×28 cm) or 9"x12" (23×30.5 cm):

In the centre, make a freehand circle (the circle does not have to be perfect) with a radius of about 2.75" (7 cm)/ diameter of 5.5" (14 cm).

Backgrounds should be a similar colour or texture, the focal point should be in the circle, inside it or in its outline. The circle can be empty or full depending on your inspiration. Both analogue and digital collage are acceptable.

Starting on World Collage Day, 14 May 2022, the selected works will be shown on Quebec Collage's Instagram (<u>@quebeccollage</u>), in its <u>Facebook gallery</u>, and in a virtual exhibition on <u>quebeccollage.com</u>. They may be also be linked with potential Quebec Collage projects.

NOTE: The work must be created for this call to artists exclusively and should not be submitted to other World Collage Day-related open calls.

A selection of the collages will be printed as Post-It blocs and the collection will be available for other expositions worldwide!





Kolaj Fest New Orleans is a multi-day festival and symposium, June 15-19, 2022. Their mission is to create a platform that allows for the exploration of critical issues around collage.

They are seeking presenters, a role that can mean many different things: Presenting Your Topic or Art Practice on a Panel, Leading a Discussion on a Topic Important to Collage, Hosting a session in the Collage Making Space, Leading a Collage-focused Workshop, Exhibiting, Conducting a Special Project during the event.

Most presenters present slide shows about their practice followed by a Q&A with the audience. They also seek artists with projects that take the spirit of Kolaj Fest out into the city of New Orleans.

They are particularly interested in: historical perspective, art world economics, the role collage has played in an artist's practice (particularly when their final work isn't collage per se); mash up culture; the relationship between contemporary art and society; museum issues; surveys of how collage was presented in exhibition; collections where collage plays a central role; the role of collage in various art movements (Modernism, Surrealism, Pop Art, etc.); utopian and dystopian imagery in art; art's role in the current political moment and, in particular, how art responds to sexism and racism; notions of power in the art world and its impact on collage.

They are particularly interested in one's experience as an artist: making art, showing art, selling art, identifying as an artist or a collagist, how the artist participates both in an art community and in society in general. We are interested in artists open to sharing how they navigate the art world. And we are interested in various approaches and strategies for collage making. This is by no means an exhaustive list.

The deadline to submit is Sunday, 10 April 2022. Submissions will be reviewed on an ongoing basis. We will notify Submitters via email no later than Saturday, 30 April 2022. <u>Click here</u> for more information.
