# February 2020 Program - "Marble-ology"

Come join us in February for an exciting and educational make-and-take session. NWCS Program Chair **Kathryn Kim** and former NWCS board member **Carole Carroll** will discuss the history of marbled paper\* and demonstrate three different marbling techniques. NWCS members will then have a chance to experiment with the various methods and bring home their results. All materials will be supplied. Bring an apron, or dress accordingly (you might get dirty). Also bring plastic bags and/or box tops to carry away your goodies. You may also bring your own papers to try (size 4x6, 5x7, not larger than 8"x10"). The marbling stations will be available after the meeting until 3:00 p.m.

## November 2019 Program Notes — Joe Rudko

Joe Rudko presented a slideshow of his work, explaining his process and inspirations. His background is in photography, and he is most inspired by Ansel Adams. Joe collects antique photos, and feels that collage is a way to use existing objects to say something else,

"bridging the old and the new." He likes folded and torn photos, and combines overlapping images, as in Venn diagrams. Joe has done this technique with cut up images from Ansel Adams books. Sometimes he creates new artworks using

papers run through a shredder. He also uses stacked photos and torn edges without planning the resulting images, and calls this process meditative at times. He likes the imperfections and surprises that happen. Joe prefers hot press watercolor paper and Yes paste. Photo spotting pens and colored pencils are used to draw parts of the collage together. #### Annual Postcard Exhibit


The **National Collage Society** Annual Post Card Exhibit is a small format show (4" x 6" postcard sized collages). This

**Lisa Sheets** has a collage in "Schwitters Army Mobilizes" at the MERZ Gallery, Edinburgh, Scotland.



Serena Barton's Wabi-Sabi Art Workshop

—Full of good ideas for mixed media work, including lots of collage. Best inspiration I got was to use collage over parts of old artworks, creating a piece of new artwork.

"Pared down to its barest essence, wabi-sabi is the Japanese art of finding beauty in imperfection and profundity in

nature, of accepting the natural cycle of growth, decay, and death. It's simple, slow, and uncluttered, and it reveres authenticity above all. Wabi-sabi is flea markets, not warehouse stores; aged wood, not Pergo; rice paper, not glass. It celebrates cracks and crevices and all the other marks that time, weather, and loving use leave behind. It reminds us that we are all but transient beings on this planet-that our bodies as well as the material world around us are in the process of returning to the dust from which we came. Through wabi-sabi, we learn to embrace liver spots, rust, frayed edges, and the march of time they represent."

Mita Mahato: "My work in paper arts was, in some ways, an accident. I had been drawn to the work of other paper artists like Saelee Oh, Nikki McClure and the amazing Henri Matisse, but didn't think of working with paper myself until my mother died. There was something about taking paper, tearing it up, slicing it into shapes or isolating patterns and colors that were already printed onto it that assuaged my grief.... Paper is such a dynamic medium. We often think of it as a flat and

blank foundation for other media (ink, paint, etc.), but paper can speak as loudly as what's put upon it."


